

In collaboration with the <u>Progressive Trustee Hub</u>, this 2025 Public Education Voter Guide is a resource to help Edmonton voters find out who is running in their ward for public school board (EPSB) trustee, and how these trustees align with the values and goals of public education advocacy (<u>listed here</u>).

Where contact information was available, nominated candidates were sent a two-part questionnaire.

We provide a Public Education Advocacy rating (out of 5) based on:

(1) candidates' questionnaire responses (if provided)

(2) platforms

- (3) experience (related to education, lived experiences, partisan politics, governance)
- (4) advocacy track record (previous public education advocacy particularly for incumbents)
 - (5) effectiveness & accountability potential

Our **Public Education Advocacy** ratings were scored through extensive consultation with a broad network of diverse advocates and activists. Background information was gathered based on candidates' engagement with partner organizations, their online content, and their participation at forums. The goal of our rating system is to evaluate candidates who

are best positioned with the values and qualifications to work collaboratively as a progressive Edmonton Public school board to vocally advocate and openly defend public education both within and outside chamber doors.



But it is unclear how candidate is familiar with trustee role and how they would logistically implement policy proposals. Candidate did not attend forums hosted by public education advocates.

Advocacy Track Record: As trustee, O'Keefe has a mixed



voting record from an advocacy point of view. As Chair of the Governance and Evaluation, the Trustee Handbook was Managed to limit registered speakers' scope and length of participation at board meetings, thus limiting democratic participation from the general public. The Caucus Committee approved the changes, which came into effect for the May 23, 2025 Special Board meeting. O'Keefe also represented the board at part of collective bargaining negotiations with support staff of CUPE 3550; the union of education workers ultimately went on strike for 9 weeks.

Effectiveness & accountability potential: Despite possibly different intentions, O'Keefe's record of closed-door advocacy resulted in an impression of overall government compliance. In the Budget 2024-25 meeting, O'Keefe voted against a proposed motion to decrease funding for seclusion rooms. O'Keefe also voted in favour of re-instating the School Resource Office (SRO) program. Compliance with harmful government policies without simultaneous visible trustee pushback could contribute to destabilization of public education. Moreover, continued deference of accountability to the un-elected superintendent is concerning.

Effectiveness & accountability potential: From various reports, Bachand has not proactively disclosed their past or current connection to the controversial Classical Charter Academy. Candidate states they would advocate for public education. Bachand has provided inconsistent responses to several key education issues such as SROs, inclusion, public funding for public education, past advocacy experience, etc. Bachand's lack of transparency calls into question future reliability if elected and ongoing or future charter school employment presents significant conflict of interest from an advocacy perspective.

Advocacy Track Record: New candidate. Candidate's history of public education specific political advocacy unclear.

Effectiveness & accountability potential: Candidate declares support for public education and outlines positions on some of the current harmful provincial policies. Candidate shows understanding of several key issues but does not appear well-versed in trustee role or implementation of infrastructure or governance decisions. More alarmingly, candidate's position on pronoun policy and likening it with "Family Law, State is Sentience" which sets age groupings for privacy allowance is problematic from multiple facets. Candidate's proposals of needs-based segregated classrooms also raises grave concerns about inclusion. Howard proposes a cap on students with complex needs in each classroom but unclear how this could be implemented equitably.

Smit does not appear to proactively disclose Catholic school involvement indicating connections to both divisions. Smit's social media content raise questions about candidate's privilege lens and his commitment to advocating for racialized and marginalized students is inconsistent. Smit seems supportive of ban on trans students playing sports and



is a clear proponent of the SRO program. Smit also invokes
Alberta flag in campaign material raising questions of M
political affiliation, or at minimum awareness of its
symbolism.

Advocacy Track Record: Kusiek was elected to the board in 2021 on progressive values. However, Kusiek's voting record and decisions as Trustee and Board Chair have not always aligned with progressive positions from her campaign. In the Budget 2024-25 meeting, Kusiek voted against a proposed motion to decrease funding for seclusion rooms. She presided as board chair when the Governance & Evaluation Committee made changes to the Trustee Handbook which limited registered speaker's scope and length of participation at board meetings, thus restricting democratic participation from the general public. The Caucus Committee approved those changes, which came into effect for the May 23 Special Board meeting. Kusiek also voted in favour of re-instating the SRO program.

Effectiveness & accountability potential: From an advocacy angle, Kusiek's past campaign supporters have raised concerns regarding progressive accountability. Regrettably, Kusiek's adoption of closed-door trustee advocacy has not yielded concrete and visible results in terms of increasing



public awareness. There have been reports of board dynamics becoming fragmented and conflicted. Through these changes, the reputation of the EPSB as a progressive board in Alberta have perceptibly diminished. Racialized and marginalized students' have reported feeling discounted by the board's approval of re-instating the SRO program as many were counting on Kusiek as the swing vote. As chair, Kusiek was a frequent validator of UCP government policy releases, although she brought forward concerns about infrastructure to the press and to the public. Overall, Kusiek's continued outward approach of compliance with harmful government policies without simultaneous vocalization of steadfast convictions could perpetuate ineffectiveness. Advocates also raise concerns about continued deference of public accountability to the un-elected superintendent.

Effectiveness & accountability potential: Lenana's platform discusses transparent parental involvement and anti-racism proposals to promote cultural change on the board. However, candidate is a proponent of public funds being directed to schools of choice such as charter, magnet, specialized schools, as a way to "promote innovation and accountability." This is antithetical to our values of public dollars staying in public schools. While candidate proposes important anti-racism perspectives to promote inclusion, Lenana's emphasis on parental involvement raises concerns related to "parental rights." Lenana also supported P3s (public-private partnerships) and gave conflicting responses regarding union support at public education forum.

Sumar was one of the few trustees who responded to constituents on contentious issues like bringing SROs back into schools. Sumar voted against Edmonton Police Service having a formal role in division schools (School Resource Officer program). In Budget 2024, Sumar put forward a motion to decrease funding in order to phase out seclusion rooms but his motion was ultimately voted down.

Effectiveness & accountability potential: Detailed platform with focus on concrete policy actions and deep logistical understanding of board governance and current issues. As a current trustee, Sumar has continually demonstrated commitment to be a vocal supporter of public education. Sumar's ongoing and current track records shows



he has navigated complex dynamics while staying true to his values with integrity. Sumar shows deep understanding of issues facing marginalized students and also carries a deep body of knowledge with his experience as an incumbent.

She voted in favour of Edmonton Police Service returning to a formal role in division schools (School Resource Officer program)

Effectiveness & accountability potential: Despite possibly different intentions, Sawyer's focus on closed-door advocacy



resulted in few instances of open advocacy that was readily accessible to the public. Sawyeralso failed to honour more racialized and marginalized students' lived experiences by voting in support of re-instating SRO program. In Budget 2024-25 meeting, Sawyer voted against a proposed motion to decrease funding for seclusion rooms. Advocates believe the approach of compliance with harmful government policies would further contribute to destabilization of public education. Moreover, continued deference of accountability to the unelected superintendent is concerning.
